Water: The EPA loan was submitted in early March for the Water Tower Project and other various projects.

The Brick Memorial has been built for the Quasquicentennial Memorial. Discussion was held on what items should be included in the time capsule.

A quote from Middendorf Construction of \$12,000.00 was received for doing repairs at the Street Department building. Nevois Construction submitted a bid of \$15,000.00. A final decision was not made yet.

Village Attorney Terry Bruckert gave the Board some information on an upcoming Bill being considered in the House. It concerns doing away with the 1% grocery tax Municipalities receive from the state. This will have a negative effect on many Municipalities .
